PARENT GOVERNORS

The governing body of Long Lawford Primary School currently has 2 Parent Governor vacancies. Parent governors fulfil all the normal functions of the governing body and are elected by the parents of the school or, where not enough candidates stand, are appointed by the governing body. Parent governors do not need to be experts in the field of education. What is required is someone with an interest in the school and the welfare of its pupils, and the time and willingness to become involved. The skills you have can be very useful to the governing body. At the moment the governing body is lacking governors who have experience and expertise in the areas of finance (management and planning), marketing and publicity, health and safety and possess an understanding of legal issues. Previous experience of being a board member in another sector or at another school would be an advantage but is not compulsory. Governors also need what is known as "soft skills" which include the ability to be able to build relationships with a range of people, to be able to work as part of a team, to be able to question and to make connections between different types of information.
