Sports Funding Report

Introduction:

The government has given schools additional funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2013 / 14 and 2014 /15 to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children so that they develop healthy lifestyles. This funding is known as **Sports premium or PE and Sports grant**.

It is the responsibility of the school governing body to report on **how sports funding is used** by the school to parents. There is no set format to do this. Long Lawford Primary School will publish details of sports funding expenditure on the school website (www.longlawfordprimaryschool.com). This report will outline how sports funding has been used in the school. The report will also detail the impact of sports funding upon the provision of PE and sport for the benefit of all pupils.

Each school will receive £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil. For Long Lawford Primary School this equates to £9450.

Key Priorities:

Our core aim is:

- To improve teacher's subject knowledge.
- To improve assessment of PE using ICT.
- To ensure outstanding PE provision at Long Lawford Primary School.
- To broaden the sporting opportunities and experiences available to all pupils.
- To develop a love of sport and physical activity.
- To ensure all pupils can swim 25 metres unaided by the end of Year 6.

What we expect to see:

Outstanding teaching is paramount to ensuring all PE lessons are good or better.

- All pupils are engaged, motivated and demonstrate a high level of understanding and skill.
- Pupils taking a lead in PE lessons where appropriate.
- All pupils have positive attitudes towards healthy and active lifestyles.
