In my assemblies this week I have spoken to the children about keeping safe at school. I also spoke to them about keeping safe online. The internet can be an amazing thing but it also comes with risks. An important starting point is to encourage your child to follow the 'click clever, click safe code.' This has 3 simple rules:

Rule 1 Zip it. This simply means zip it as regards personal information. Never disclose full name, address, school, places you like to go or telephone numbers.

Rule 2 Block it. Block people who send nasty or unkind messages and don't open unknown links and attachments.

Rule 3 Flag it. Flag up with someone you trust if anything upsets you or if someone asks to meet you offline. It is important for parents and carers to take an interest in what their child does on the internet and to talk to them about making the right choices. Remind them of what to do when they just don't feel happy about something. It is also worth telling children that people online may not be who they say they are.
